## Kentucky SNAP Time Limit

## Reporting Requirements Screening Tool

Starting July 2023, SNAP recipients between 18 and 49 will have to meet work monthly work requirements or they will lose their benefits. However, there are exemptions from this rule including having a child in the home or a documented disability. Other exemptions are below:

If you have checked YES to ANY of the above exemptions, you are NOT subjected to the time limit reporting requirement.
